

I would like to tell you about my grand-father.

His name was Voronin Pavel Mikhailovich.

He was at the Second World War.

Before the War my grand-father graduated Vladimir Philology Institute and worked in Krasnoyarskij region when he joined the Soviet Army in 1940. My grand-father was at Solovetsk islands when the Second World War began.

He fought at Volkovskij front.

My grand-father was awarded the "Medal of Honor for Bravery" and "Medal for the defense of Leningrad". He participated in the break of the siege of Leningrad. His battery of 152 soldiers broke through the defense of "Nevsky pyatachok". His military rank was the guard Sergeant, senior political officer of the company. My grand-father was demobilized in August 1945.

After the War my grand-father served as an instructor in Karelia.

My other grandfather, Nikolai, was called up in 1941 from the Novgorod region, a small town of Borovichi.

Served in the Marine Corps in the Arctic on Rybachy Island, was wounded, but not seriously, and the field returned to service.

When the war ended, he returned home.
